Awards & Scholarships

Every CBE high school offers specific awards to their students to recognize outstanding achievements, accomplishments, and contributions. There are awards for academics, complementary subjects, athletics, citizenship, and leadership. As well as awards offered by individual schools, many scholarships are offered to you at a district and provincial level.



- Student recognition occurs at our Academic Awards evening in early June
- Subject Area Awards
 - Each course's teachers select between 1-6 students to honour (depends on number of students in a particular course)
 - Based on academic achievement, classroom leadership, work ethic
 - Students receive an individual certification of recognition



- Student recognition occurs at our Academic Awards evening in early June
- Student of the Year Awards
 - Based on teacher nominations
 - Four criteria that we ask our staff to look at:
 - Citizenship
 - Scholastics
 - School Involvement
 - Leadership
 - Usually have about 20-25 students nominated by staff per grade and we have staff vote for up to 8 students to receive Student of the Year Awards
 - Students receive a certificate and their name appears on a Student of the Year plaque in our Awards Cabinet

- Scholarship Program
 - Run through the guidance office through the leadership of Julie Nishimura
 - Student D2L shell that promotes various Scholarships available to students

 - Maureen Coulombe Award
 - Grade 12 student nominated by the French Immersion teachers
 - Recognized with a certificate and student name on plaque in our awards display case
 - Merit Construction Award
 - Grade 12 student nominated by the Career and Technology Studies Department
 - Recognized with a certificate and \$300 award and a photograph in our awards display case
 - Chinook Rotary Club Award
 - Presented annually to a Grade 12 student who has demonstrated significant involvement in school activities and a commitment to community (Donated by the Rotary Club of Calgary)
 - Recognized with a certificate and student name on plaque in our awards display case



- Student recognition occurs at our Academic Awards evening in early June
- Major Awards (Selected by Awards Committee unless otherwise noted)
 - Premier's Citizenship Award
 - Grade 12 student
 - One of three Alberta Citizenship Awards that recognize students who have contributed to their communities through public service and voluntary endeavour
 - Recognized with a letter from the Premier and a photograph in awards display case
 - Tebo Memorial Award for Journalism
 - Grade 12 student nominated by the Journalism teachers
 - Recognized with a certificate, a \$500 award and a trophy in our awards display case
 - Schulich Leader Scholarship
 - Recognizing the increasing importance and impact that STEM disciplines have on the prosperity of future generations, businessman and philanthropist Seymour Schulich established this \$200 million scholarship fund in 2012 to encourage Canada's best and brightest students to become Schulich Leader Scholars: the next generation of entrepreneurial minded, technology innovators.

 - Recognized with a certificate and student name on plaque in our awards display case




- Student recognition occurs at our Academic Awards evening in early June
- Major Awards (Selected by Awards Committee unless otherwise noted)
 - University of Toronto Book Award
 - Grade 11 student
 - These are students who demonstrate superior academic performance, original and creative thought, and exceptional achievement in a broad context. They excel in academic pursuits, demonstrate enthusiasm for intellectual exploration and have a strong involvement in the lives of their schools and communities.
 - Nominated by our Humanities department
 - Recognized with a book from the University of Toronto and a photograph in awards display case
 - Spirit of Scarlett Award
 - Presented to grade 12 students recognizing significant contributions to citizenship at Scarlett. Captures the essence of Scarlett, who in their own way have left a mark on our school. Individuals who foster growth in others and personified hard work and perseverance.
 - Recognized with a certificate and a trophy in our awards display case
 - Don Robinson Award
 - Presented to a Grade 12 student who demonstrates scholastic performance and outstanding leadership in student activities.Dr. E.P. Scarlett Awards committee nominates one applicant per year
 - Recognized with a certificate and student name on plaque in our awards display case

 - Presented to student (s) deemed to have represented the school with notable distinction in a variety of areas. Individuals who conduct themselves with class in everything they do and act as ambassadors for Dr. E.P. Scarlett
 - Nominated by Dr. Goodfellow
 - Recognized with a certificate and a trophy in awards display case
 - Governor General Award
 - Presented to graduating grade 12 student with the highest average in Grade 11 and Grade 12 courses taken in Alberta
 - Recognized with a certificate, a medal and a plaque in our awards display case

HONOUR ROLL

- Students recognized for academic achievement
- Students receive a certificate (upon request) and their name goes on our Honour Roll located in our Honour Roll Display Case
- Honours
 - Students earning an average between 79.50% and 89.49%
 - Students must be enrolled in courses that have a potential credit count of 10 in a semester
 - Students must earn credits in all courses/modules that they are enrolled in
- Honours with Distinction
 - Students earning an average above 89.50%
 - Students must be enrolled in courses that have a potential credit count of 10 in a semester
 - Students must earn credits in all courses/modules that they are enrolled in

LANCERS OF THE MONTH

- Nominated by teachers and selected by our Leadership teachers
- Students selected based on their service to the Lancer Community
- Students get a photo in a display case as well as a Lancer of the Month Certificate





ATHLETIC AWARDS

- Students recognized at the Night of the Lancer in early June
- Each Lancers team nominates Most Valuable Players and Athletes of Distinction
 - Voted on by teammates or as a coach's selection
- Athletes of the Year
 - Selected by Lancer Athletic coaches via a points based system
- Tom Sorenson Award
 - The Tom Sorenson Award is presented to a grade 12 student athlete who has been heavily involved in Scarlett Athletics throughout their three years at Dr. E.P. Scarlett High School.
 - Selected by Lancer Athletic coaches
- Al Taylor Award
 - Grade 12 students who have been involved in the Athletic program at Dr. E.P. Scarlett during their three years of high school and moving into post-secondary education
 - Selected by Lancer Athletic coaches at the end of the year
 - Students receive a letter from the Calgary Booster Club and \$500
