What is Advanced Placement?









- "The Advanced Placement Program® (AP) enables willing and academically prepared students to pursue college-level studies while still in high school"
 - College Board

What is Advanced Placement?







- Cohorted classes from grade 10 through grade 12 enrich the breadth and depth of the regular curricula and prepare students to write an Advanced Placement exam
 - The exam is written in May after the full sequence of the course (grade 12 or 11)
- AP exams are international, standardized exams, which can earn students advanced credit or standing at many universities/colleges

AP vs. IB







- Both are great programs
 - International recognition (AP is American, IB is International)
 - Post-secondary credits
 - Parallel in terms of academic rigour & excitement

Differences:

- IB requires a minimum of 2 classes in the program
 - AP is flexible (1 or more)
- IB has additional requirements (Theory of Knowledge, community service, essay, etc.)











- Because you love a subject!
 - Pick the classes you love most and have a **personal** interest in
- Because you want to learn more about that subject and develop related skills
- Because you want to be in classes with like-minded peers with an "atmosphere of enthusiasm"

Why Take Advanced Placement?









- Because you are a hard-working and motivated student who is looking for more academic rigour, engagement, and excitement
- Because you are interested in earning university level credits while in high school! (Save yourself time and \$\$)

Why Take Advanced Placement?









- Because you are interested in preparing for post-secondary
 - Skills such as problem-solving, critical thinking, creativity, curiosity...
- Because you are interested in becoming a more confident, independent student
 - Skills such as study habits, time management, work ethic...

Advanced Placement at Scarlett









- Large & long-running program
 - 25% of our students take at least one AP class
 - Experienced teachers in welldeveloped programs
 - New programs being added

 Cohorted classes allow for more direct instruction and an enriched classroom environment

Advanced Placement at Scarlett









- Scarlett kids do well! We exceed international and provincial averages on all AP exams.
- Last year...
 - Scarlett students wrote 339 AP exams
 - 90% earned a score of 3 out of 5 or higher
 - Students earned scholar awards from The College Board:
 - 11 students achieved the AP Scholar Award
 - 13 AP Scholars with Honor
 - 16 AP Scholars with Distinction



AP Courses at Scarlett























- First 2 weeks of May
- Cost of approx. \$160 per exam
- •AP exam is typically written at the grade 12 level of a course
 - Except: Physics 20
 - Chemistry 20/30/25 and Biology 20/30/35 are offered as full-year classes and can be in grade 11 or 12
- Scoring a 4 or a 5 on the exam can earn post-secondary credits
 - Policies do vary, however.

Mythbusting









- Myth: "AP is too hard"
 - Yes, AP is a challenge and involves academic rigour and work, but students are supported and given a reasonable pace and resources.

- Myth: "AP teachers are scary"
 - The AP teachers at Scarlett are experienced, kind, supportive, passionate and creative teachers

Mythbusting









- Myth: Students get worse grades in AP classes
 - Students are graded using Alberta standards & assessments
 - Students write the SAME assessments and final exams as the regular classes
 - They are NOT marks-penalized
 - In the instance where an assessment is done on AP content, the mark is used as a bonus or replacement opportunity
 - The classroom environment and enrichment often means students do better because they have AP enrichment











- Myth: AP is risky
 - Students are not marks-penalized,
 so there is no academic risk to try
 - Students benefit in many ways from their experiences in AP classes
 - Students can change streams for the following year (i.e. move into or out of AP)
